



Health Guidelines for Parents/Guardians

Keep your child home if.....	Your child can return to school when...
*Your child has a FEVER of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or more	*He/she is fever free for 24 <u>without Tylenol or Advil</u>
*Your child has VOMITING within the previous twelve hours, has persistent DIARRHEA or severe abdominal pain	*He/she has not vomited or had an episode of diarrhea for 24 hours after last episode.
*Your child has RED EYE(S) with discharge	*After he/she has been seen by the doctor. If the student is diagnosed with pinkeye he/she must be treated with antibiotic for 24 hours before returning.
*Your child has an EARACHE	*He/she is fever free, not complained of earache and has been treated by physician if indicated.
*Your child has an undiagnosed RASH	*The rash has been diagnosed by a physician and found <u>not</u> to be contagious to others. Written documentation will be needed from the doctor and it will need to be sent to school.
*Your child has LICE	*He/she has been treated accordingly and the home treated. The student will need to be brought to school by the parent/guardian and checked by the school nurse or other designated personnel. Student may also be taken to the Mason County Health Department and they will provide a written note for the child to reenter school.

Your child will be sent home from school if:

- *He/she has a temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or more.
- *Lice
- *Rash
- *Red eyes with discharge
- *Diarrhea (2 loose bowel movements within 2 hours)
- *Vomiting

Medications cannot be given at school without the correct paperwork being complete by parent and physician. Please contact the school and speak to your school nurse for further information.

TO SCHOOL OR NOT TO SCHOOL



CHECKLIST:

- *Keep your child home if he/she has a fever (100 degrees F or more)**
- *Student must be FEVER FREE for 24 hours without Tylenol (Acetaminophen) or Advil (Ibuprofen) before returning to school.**
- *Keep your child home if there are obvious signs of respiratory illness, such as thick nasal drainage, frequent cough, severe sore throat, earache, or drainage from the eyes.**
- *Keep your child home if he/she has vomited within the previous 12 hours, or has diarrhea, or severe abdominal pain.**
- *Keep your child home if there is any unidentified (therefore, possibly contagious) rash or any open skin lesions.**
- *Keep your child home if he/she has an untreated head lice infestation. This is a strictly enforced county policy.**
